Memorial Day Tidbits

| May 31

► Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service to protect our freedom. Servicemen's graves were decorated with wild flowers that were available in May.

► On Memorial Day, the flag should be at half-staff until noon only, then raised to the top of the staff for the remainder of the day.

► The tradition of wearing red poppies began in 1915. Inspired by the poem "Flanders Fields", Moira Michael replied with her own poem.

**We cherish too, the poppy red,
That grows on fields where valor led,
It seems to signal to the skies,
That blood of heroes never dies.**

She sold them to her friends and co-workers with the money going to benefit servicemen in need.

► At 3 p.m. local time, Americans should pause for a moment of silence or listen to the bugle call of "Taps."

► Visiting cemeteries on Memorial Day has become a tradition for Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts. After an honorary ceremony, the tradition of "flags in" continues as the scouts all place flags on the graves of soldiers.

► The south refused to honor the dead on Memorial Day until after World War I when the meaning of Memorial Day changed from honoring Civil War dead to honoring Americans who died fighting any war.

Respect For Authority

Recently within our city there have been a couple of incidents that have negatively reflected upon our law enforcement officials. The scriptures teach that we should respect and obey our leaders. Romans 13:1, teaches we are to be in subjection to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those which exist are established by God. Therefore, he who resists authority has opposed the ordinance of God. However, this doesn't mean that we are to uphold or support them when they are wrong. One indicator of character and integrity is when a person is willing to admit that they are in error, when it is demonstrated to them. Memphis has gained a lot of attention due to the convict who was allowed to escape from custody prior to the jury announcing their verdict of guilty. To add insult to injury after his capture, and within a week of his escape, he was erroneously released from custody. This was followed by our officers serving a warrant to the wrong house, intimidating the residents, and causing considerable damage to their property. Hopefully we all understand that in an effort to serve and protect the public, mistakes will be made, but that isn't what has caused the uproar within the city. The problem is that the officials aren't willing to say that they were wrong, offer an apology to the residents, and compensate them for the damages done. By far the men and women within the sheriff's department and the police officers of the city do an exceptional job, considering the danger and magnitude of crime within this city. However, without sound, solid leadership the subordinates don't have a basis for a positive attitude about their jobs and performance. We tend to look up to leaders who are willing to say that they were wrong, because it allows us to see the human side of them, and motivates us to aspire to their positions. There is no substitute for good moral character.
